Margaret Oluwafunmilayo Adeloye (Nee Bamigbaye)

Monday, the 6th day of May, 1963 welcomed a bundle of joy from the birth of a bouncing baby girl into the catholic household of Gerald Folorunsho and union of Susana Omobolanle Bamigbaye of Iree town, christened Oluwafunmilayo, Abidemi Margaret Bamigbaye

As the first daughter of the humble family, customarily, Margaret generally, called Funmi or Adunni, had all the attention and love any child could ever hope for from his or her parents while being nurtured with the necessary discipline, right christian and societal values, and encouragements.

MAGGIE started early education at Saint Ita's Catholic School Sasere, Ondo in 1969 and excelled in all she did. On HER PARENTS' order in 1972, she went to live with her paternal uncle in Oyo Town.

At Oyo, Margaret continued her primary education at the prestigious saint Augustine roman catholic missions' primary school Oyo where she completed her elementary education in 1976 in flying colors. Margaret's ambitiousness and resilience soon paid off when she got a job with the University College Hospital (UCH) in Ibadan, {an arm of the renowned University of Ibadan, The Premier University in Nigeria} as a cashier or teller where she worked till 2009 when she relocated to the United States with her family. Upon arriving in the United States, she quickly enrolled for the Certified Nurse Assistant (CNA) and Geriatrics Nurse Assistant (GNA) programs at the Gandhi Institute of Health Foundation Baltimore and completed the programs in excellence. She is currently enrolled as a fulltime student at the Baltimore City Community College (BCCC) in general studies with interest in Nursing while still working full-time. Margaret met her lovely husband, her sweetheart, her companion, and leader (putting things in the right perspective Margaret's meekness and how she sees her husband) Dominic Adeloye at Ibadan in 1988. though she found him really adorable, yet she still gave him some hard times to work and earn her love because she believed that whatever one does not suffer to earn would not be jealously guarded or cherished and such a thing would not last- little wonder why her marriage is still standing and vibrant in the face numerous challenges.

They both got married in 1991 and their marriage since then has been blessed with - Oluwadamilare, Oluwadamilola, and Oluwadamisola- all God-fearing and responsible children that make her and her husband joyous and thankful to God.

As a person, Margaret operates on the simple life principle laid out by Apostle Paul in Philippians 3: 12-14
